

Goddard Paget & Goddard 1889 - 1900

Goddard Paget & Goddard originated as Goddard & Paget, an architectural partnership formed by [Joseph Goddard](#) (1840-1900) and [Alfred Henry Paget](#) (1848-1909) in Leicester, England in 1874. The practice was renamed Goddard Paget & Goddard when, in 1889, Joseph Goddard's son [Henry Langton Goddard](#) (1866-1944) became a partner. The name changed again to [Goddard, Paget & Catlow](#) in 1895 when [Walter Albert Catlow](#) (c.1860-1918) became a partner in the firm. Following the death of Goddard senior in 1900, the practice became known as [Goddard & Catlow](#) [and as Goddard & Co.], however, work by the firm exhibited at the Royal Academy in London in 1904 was still listed in the catalogue as by Goddard, Paget & Catlow
