

Goddard, Paget & Catlow 1895 - ?

Goddard, Paget & Catlow [also known as Goddard & Co.] originated as [Goddard & Paget](#), an architectural firm founded in Leicester, England in 1874 by [Joseph Goddard](#) (1840-1900) and [Alfred Henry Paget](#) (1848-1909). The practice was renamed [Goddard Paget & Goddard](#) when, in 1889, Joseph Goddard's son [Henry Langton Goddard](#) (1866-1944) became a partner. The name changed to [Goddard, Paget & Catlow](#) in 1895 when [Walter Albert Catlow](#) (c.1860-1918) joined the partnership. Following the death of Goddard senior in 1900, the title of the firm changed to [Goddard & Catlow](#) [and as Goddard & Co.], however, work by the firm exhibited at the Royal Academy in London in 1904 was still listed in the catalogue as by Goddard, Paget & Catlow
