Tubbs, Messer & Poulter

Tubbs, Messer & Poulter originated as <u>Tubbs & Messer</u>, an architectural partnership formed by <u>Cyril Bazett Tubbs</u> (1859-1927) and <u>Arthur Albert Messer</u> (1863-1934) in 1898. In c.1913 (?) Poulter* became a partner. The practice was active from 1913 to c.191515

One of the firm's clients was the stationery chain W. H. Smith for whom they designed premises.

Tubbs, Messer & Poulter had offices in London, at 10 The Broadway, Woking, Surrey, at 7 Cantelope Road, Bexhill, Sussex, and possibly Newbury, Berkshire. The architect Geoffrey Paxton Ravenor (1893-1916) briefly worked for the firm in 1913-14.
