Peacock Bewlay & Cooke

Cossins Peacock & Bewlay was an architectural partnership formed in Birmingham, England in the late 1890s by <u>Jethroe Anstice Cossins</u> (1830-1917), <u>Frank Barry Peacock</u> (1859-1937) and <u>Hubert Rawson Bewlay</u> (1869-1904). When he became ill, he was replaced in the partnership by his younger brother, <u>Ernest Chawner Bewlay</u> (1872-1942) in c.1900.

Cossins subsequently withdrew from the practice and by 1916 Peacock and Bewlay were in partnership with <u>Samuel Nathaniel Cooke</u> (1882-1964) as <u>Peacock Bewlay & Cooke</u> in Birmingham. Cooke at some time also dropped out of the partnership and Peacock and Bewlay continued the practice as Peacock & Bewlay. The partnership was eventually dissolved in December 1934.
