

## Lander, Bedells & Crompton 1899 - ?

Lander, Bedells & Crompton originated as Lander & Bedells, an architectural partnership formed in London, England in 1854 by [Richard Smith Lander](#) (1827-1892) and [Charles King Bedells](#) (1832-1897). Their office was located in Bedford Row

In 1899 [William Edward Vernon Crompton](#) (1867-1937) joined the business which was renamed Lander Bedells & Crompton. The firm was active until at least the early 1930s

Note: Harold Clapham Lander (1868-1935), son of Richard Smith Lander, may also have been a partner in the firm
