Stewart, James S. 1866 - 1904

James S. Stewart was born in Perth, Scotland in 1866. He trained as an architect in the office of George Campbell Sherrin (1843-1909) in London and studied at the Royal Academy Schools in London where he was awarded the Gold and Silver Medals. Between 1896 and 1904 he was in partnership with <u>Henry Vaughan</u> <u>Lanchester (1863-1953) and Edwin Alfred Rickards</u> (1872-1920) in the Londonbased architectural firm <u>Lanchester, Stewart & Rickards</u>. Stewart died on 3 August 1904.
