The British Government pavilion at the Exposition Universelle et Internationale (Expo 58) in Brussels in 1958, the Headquarters of the City and Guilds of London Institute, the Grandstand for Leopardstown Racecourse in Leopardstown, Co. Dublin (1971), the Headquarters of the British Council in London, the Calgary Exhibition and Stampede, the Royal Yachting Association National Yacht Racing Centre and Nuclear Power Stations at Dungeness, Hunterston and Inverkep.

Howard V. Lobb & Partners also designed numerous schools for various county authorities. Howard V. Lobb & Partner later became the Lobb Partnership and Lobb Sports Architecture and were responsible for designing several sports stadia.
