Brewill & Baily

Brewill & Baily was an architectural partnership formed by <u>Arthur William Lancelot Brewill</u> (1861-1923) and <u>Basil Edgar Baily</u> (1869-1942) in Nottingham, England in 1894.

The practice was active in Nottingham and nearby Derbyshire. The partnership was dissolved in July 1922. Brewill died the following year.
