The partnership several private houses and commercial premises in the Nottingham area. The partnership was dissolved in 1911

Work by the partnership included alterations to Nottingham Savings Bank, 11 Low Pavement, Nottingham (1903); Shops and houses, Victoria Embankment, Nottingham (1904); Thorncliff, St Andrew's Road, Nottingham (1904); 3 Thorncliffe Rise, Nottingham (1905); enlargement of Lady Bay Church, Nottingham (1906); 30 Bridlesmith Gate, Nottingham (1906-07); The Canon Lewis Memorial Hall, Ransom Road, Nottingham (1907); The Dorothy Boot Homes, Wilford, Nottingham (1908); and Enfield Chambers, 14-16 Low Pavement, Nottingham (1909-10)
