

Dunn, Watson & Curtis Green 1912 - 1916

Dunn, Watson & Curtis Green originated as [Dunn & Watson](#), an architectural firm established in London, England by [William Newton Dunn](#) (1859-1934) and [Robert Watson](#) (1865-1916) in 1890. The practice was renamed [Dunn, Watson & Curtis Green](#) when [William Curtis Green](#) (1875-1960) joined the partnership in 1912. Following the death of Watson in 1916 the firm became [Dunn & Curtis Green](#). The partnership was dissolved in 1919 when Dunn retired to Kenya
