Scott, Shepherd & Breakwell 1934 - c. 1938

Scott, Shepherd & Breakwell originated as <u>Scott, Chesterton & Shepherd</u>, an architectural partnership formed in London , England <u>Elisabeth Whitworth Scott</u> (1898-1972), <u>Maurice Chesterton</u> (1883-1962), <u>John Chiene Shepherd</u> (1896-1978) and Alison Shepherd (1898-1972), formerly <u>Alison Sleigh</u>, in 1929. By 1936 Chesterton had withdrawn from the practice and <u>John Breakwell</u> (c.1905-1959) became a partner in the firm which was renamed <u>Scott</u>, <u>Shepherd & Breakwell</u>. Notable among projects by Scott, Shepherd & Breakwell. was the Fawcett Building at Newnham College, Cambridge, competed in 1938. A house designed by Scott, Shepherd & Breakwell for the Modern Homes Exhibition at Gidea Park, Essex, in 1934 is discussed in Small Houses £500-£2500 (1927 p. 89). The partnership was dissolved in c.1938
