Franks, Ronald Herbert 1911 - 1996

Ronald Herbert Franks was born in Hackney, London, England on 9 March 1911. It is not known where or with whom he trained as an architect. He was elected an Associate of the Royal Institute of British Architects (ARIBA) in 1937.

A house in Holland-on-Sea, Essex designed by him is discussed in Small Houses £500-£2500, edited by H. Myles Wright (1937 p. 98) and in Seaside Houses and Bungalows. edited by Ella Carter (London: Country Life 1937 pp. 50-51). His address was given as 60 Lichfield Grove, Church End, Finchley, London in 1939; and 1 Bloomfield Road, London in 1950. He died in Westminster, London on 13 September 1986
