

Sproat, Shaw, Vowles & Clayton

Sproat, Shaw, Vowles & Clayton was an architectural partnership active in Liverpool, England in the early years of the twentieth century. It was formed by Arthur Joseph Singleton Shaw (1871-1943) and Thomas Hubert Hardinge Vowles (1872-1946, (?) Sproat and (?) Clayton. Nothing is known about Sproat and Clayton.

In 1905 the firm submitted an entry in a competition to design Lambeth Municipal Buildings. It may not have been a formal partnership and was possibly formed specifically for this competition. It may not have designed anything else. Their entry is illustrated in *British Competitions in Architecture* volume 1, no. 1, January 1905 (pp. 38, 39)
