

Maitland, Richard Macleod 1917 - 1976



Richard Macleod Maitland [also known as Dick Maitland] was born in London, England* on 7 September 1917 and trained at the Architectural Association School in London from where he received a DipAA. He was also elected an Associate of the Royal Institute of British Architects (ARIBA). In 1949, with fellow Architectural Association graduates [James Cubitt](#) (1914-1983), [Stefan Buzás](#) (1915-2008) and [Thomas William Fello Atkinson](#) (1919-1982) he formed [James Cubitt & Partners](#). He subsequently remained with the firm until he retired from the practice in 1959. During the 1950s Maitland worked briefly in a branch of Cubitt at the Gold Coast (Ghana).

His address was given as Frimley Place, Old Disley Road, Frimley, Surrey in 1939. He died in London on 29 March 1976.

* His place of birth is sometimes incorrectly given as St. Andrews, Scotland
