

Prestwich, Ernest 1889 - 1977

Ernest Prestwich was born in Leigh, Lancashire, England on 29 August 1889 and was the son of James Caldwell Prestwich (1852-1940). In 1906 he entered the University of Liverpool School of Architecture from where he graduated with a B.A. in 1910. That year he won a competition for planning the completion of the model village of Port Sunlight. In 1912 he was awarded an M.A. by the University of Liverpool.

In 1912 he joined his father and his brother, Harold Oswald Prestwich (1881-1953), in the family architectural firm in Leigh, which subsequently became Prestwich & Sons. He was also employed for a period in the Architects Department of Lever Brothers and worked on various projects for the company including Thornton Hough War Memorial and the Stornoway Planning Scheme.

Ernest Prestwich was elected an Associate of the Royal Institute of British Architects (ARIBA) in 1918 and a Fellow of the Royal Institute of British Architects (FRIBA) in 1928. He was awarded the RIBA Architecture Bronze Medal for Manchester in 1938.

His address was given as "Everdene", Hand Lane, Leigh, Lancashire in 1923 and 1926; Bradshawgate Chambers, Leigh, Lancashire in 1939; and 2 Bamber Gardens, Southport, Lancashire in 1977. He died in Southport, Lancashire on 4 November 1977.
