Sloot, Lambert Louis Theodore 1894 - 1970

Lambertus Louis Theodoor Sloot [commonly known as Lambert Louis Theodore Sloot] was born to Dutch parents in Willesden, Middlesex, England on 4 July 1894. It is not known where and with whom he trained as an architect. He was elected an Associate of the Royal Institute of British Architects (ARIBA) in 1926. During the late 1920s and early 1930s he was employed by the architectural firm Stark & McNeill in Ipoh, Federal Malay States. By c.1933 he had returned to England and had formed the partnership <u>Bertram Carter & Sloot</u> with <u>George Bertram Carter</u> (1896-1986), with an office at 14 Clifford's Inn, Temple, London. The partnership appears to have been dissolved by the end of 1935 and Sloot subsequently worked alone.

Sloot was elected a Fellow of the Royal Institute of British Architects (FRIBA) in 1937.

His address was given as 8 Callcott Road, Willesen, Middlesex in 1901; 115 Greencroft Gardens, West Hampstead, London in 1911; 3 Ormond Avenue, Henley-on-Thames, Middlesex in 1927; 16 Berkeley Square, London in 1936; "Homefield", Langbank, Renfrewshire, Scotland in 1939; 69 Warwick Square, Westminster, London in 1945; and 117 Western Avenue, London in 1970. He died on 10 December 1970. His death was registered in Ealing, London
