

Anderson (Rowand), Paul & Partners

Rowand Anderson, Paul & Partners Anderson was an architectural practice established in Edinburgh, Scotland in 1934. It had its origins in Rowand Anderson & Paul a partnership formed by [Sir Robert Rowand Anderson](#) (1834-1921) and Arthur Forman Balfour Paul (1875-1938) in 1907.

The firm became Rowand Anderson, Paul & Partners in 1934 when [Basil Unwin Spence](#) (1907-1976) and William Kininmonth (1904-1988) were made partners in the practice.

In 1946 Spence left to set up his own independent practice and at this point the firm was renamed Rowand Anderson Kininmonth & Paul. By this time the two original partners had died - Anderson in 1921 and Paul in 1938.
