

Kininmonth & Spence 1931 - 1934

Kininmonth & Spence was a short-lived architectural partnership formed in Edinburgh, Scotland in October 1931 by William Hardie Kininmonth (1904-1988) and Basil Urwin Spence (1907-1976). Both had spent a period training in the office of Edwin L. Lutyens in 1929-30 and had studied at the University of London.

In 1934 the practice merged with the Edinburgh firm Rowand Anderson & Balfour Paul to form Rowand Anderson & Paul & Partners
