

Forbes & Tate & Victor Smith

Forbes & Tate & Victor Smith originated as [Forbes & Tate](#), an architectural partnership formed by [James Edwin Forbes](#) (1876-1955) and [John Duncan Tate](#) (1880-1930) in London, England in 1905. The partnership was dissolved in 1930 following the death of Tate. By 1937 the partnership had been reformed as [Forbes & Tate & Victor Smith](#), with Victor Smith [possibly [Reginald Victor Smith](#) (1885-1971)] as a partner. "Riverbank", an apartment block in Staines, Middlesex designed by Forbes & Tate & Victor Smith in 1937 is described in *Flats: Municipal and Private Enterprise* (London: Ascot Gas Water Heaters Ltd., 1938 pp. 206-211).
