Armstrong & Gardner

Armstrong & Gardner was an architectural partnership formed by <u>Charles</u> <u>Montague Cecil Armstrong</u> (1874-1959) and <u>Alfred Herbert Gardner</u>. They were active in the 1930s and had offices at 39 High Street, Warwick, Warwickshire and 16 Priory Row, Coventry, Warwickshire.. The firm designed an extension to a Medieval manor house in Tysoe, Warwickshire in 1932; and designed "Eastcliffe", a house at Bembridge on the Isle of Wight in c.1934. The latter house is discussed in Modern Small Country Houses, edited by Roger Smithells (London: Country Life, 1936 pp. 30-33).
