

Timmins, Samuel Dennis Walley 1900 - 1951

Samuel Dennis Walley Timmins [also known as S. D. W. Timmins] was born in Walsall, Staffordshire, England on 23 October 1900. It is not known where or with whom he trained as an architect. He was elected a Licentiate of the Royal Institute of British Architects (LRIBA) in 1932. He practised as an architect in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire throughout his career as an architect. A bungalow in Wolverhampton designed by him is discussed in *Seaside Houses and Bungalows*, edited by Ella Carter (London: Country Life, 1937 pp. 96-97).

In addition to his work as an architect, Timmins was also a painter. He exhibited at the Royal Birmingham Society of Artists between 1921 and 1936.

Timmins died in Wolverhampton, Staffordshire on 17 October 1951. His address at the time of his death was 2 Claregate, Tettenhall, Staffordshire
