

## **John Brown & A. E. Henson c. 1931 - ?**

John Brown & A. E. Henson [known as Sir John Brown & A. E. Henson; also known from the late 1930s as Sir John Brown & A. E. Henson & Partners] was an architectural partnership formed in Northampton, Northamptonshire in c.1931 by [John Brown](#) (1880-1958), and his long-time assistant [Arthur Edward Henson](#) (1899-1978). The firm had offices in Northampton and London. The firm was active until at least the early 1970s
