

Davies, Sydney Everard 1865 - 1926

Sydney Everard Davies was born in Croydon, Surrey, England in July 1865 and was articled to John Edward Sears (1857-1941). He was for several years an improver with George Shaw, a contractor in Westminster. Davies commenced practice in London in 1895 and from 1900 was a partner in Robins A Co., architects and surveyors in London.

Davies was elected a Member of the Society of Architects (MSA) and was admitted a Licentiate of the Royal Institute of British Architects (LRIBA) in 1925. He died in Bournemouth, Dorset in December 1926
