

Jones, Frank John 1869 - 1937

Frank John Jones [also known as Frank J. Jones] was born in Dutton, Cheshire, England, in 1869. After training with John Douglas (1830-1911) and Daniel Porter Fordham (1846-1899) of Douglas & Fordham in Chester, Cheshire for six years, he was articled to Charles Linaker and Samuel Davies of Linaker & Davies in Frodsham, Cheshire. In 1902 he commenced independent practice in Frodsham and Runcorn, Cheshire.

Jones was a Member of the Society of Architects (MSA) and was admitted a Licentiate of the Royal Institute of British Architects (LRIBA) in 1925. His address was given as Bank Chambers, Runcorn, and 118, Greenway Road, Runcorn in 1914; Commercial Buildings, High Street Runcorn, Cheshire in 1927 and 1933; and The Croft, Fluin Lane, Frodsham, Cheshire in 1937. He died on 15 August 1937

Large extension to Jam factory, Frodsham, with cottages for same; detached villas, Frodsham, Helsby, and Runcorn; semi-detached villas in suburbs of Runcorn; Hale, near Widnes; head stables for Runcorn and Widnes Co-operative Society, together with new branch shops, warehouses, &c.; country hotel, &c, Frodsham Bridge, Cheshire; altered and enlarged number of hotels for Burton Wood Brewery Co., Collins Green; special sanitary surveyor (under Town Planning Act) for Runcorn Rural District Council and new streets for same body; several surveys of estates; quantity surveyor for new county schools, Runcorn; many houses in concrete blocks, Runcorn
