

Marten, William Henry Herbert 1856 - 1945

William Henry Herbert Marten was born in Apperley Bridge, Yorkshire, England on 28 January 1856. He was articled to James Thomas Walford and T. Pollard of Walford & Pollard in London and Bradford, Yorkshire from 1872 to 1876 and remained with them as their assistant for a further year. He was also an assistant to (?) Ferguson in Carlisle.

Marten commenced practice as an independent architect in 1879 and was in partnership with his brother, [John Ellis Marten](#) (1857-1932) in Bradford. The partnership was dissolved in 1903.

He was elected a Licentiate of the Royal Institute of British Architects (LRIBA) in 1911 and was a member of the Bradford Architects and Surveyors' Society. His address was given as 25 Cheapside, Bradford, Yorkshire in 1902; 7 Church Street, Ilkley, Yorkshire in 1911; 3, Cookridge Street, Leeds, "The Spa", Ilkley, Yorkshire; "Moor Cot", Ben Rhydding, Yorkshire in 1911 and 1914; 50, Cookridge Street, Leeds in 1923 and 1926; 76 Albion Street, Leeds, Yorkshire in 1930; and Moorcot, Moor Lane, Guisley, Yorkshire in 1945. He died in Wharfedale, Yorkshire on 16 November 1945
