Eaton, Arthur & Son c. 1921 - 1940

Arthur Eaton & Son was an architectural partnership formed in Derby, England in c.1921 by <u>Arthur Eaton</u> (1857-1924) and his son, <u>George Morley Eaton</u> (1889-1940). Following the death of Eaton senior, George Morley Easton continued the practice until 1940 with the title of the firm unchanged.
