

Slater & Moberly

Slater & Moberly was an architectural partnership formed in London, England in the 1920s by [John Alan Slater](#) (1885-1963) and [Arthur Hamilton Moberly](#). In 1932-36 they designed the Peter Jones department store in Sloane Square, London, in collaboration with [Charles Herbert Reilly](#) (1874-1948) and [William Crabtree](#) (1905-1991). In 1936 the New Zealand-born architect [Reginald Harold Uren](#) (1906-1988) joined the practice which was renamed Slater, Moberly & Uren. The practice later became Slater, Uren & Pike
