Slater & Moberly

Slater & Moberly was an architectural partnership formed in London, England in the 1920s by John Alan Slater (1885-1963) and Arthur Hamilton Moberly. In 1932-36 they designed the Peter Jones department store in Sloane Square, London, in collaboration with <u>Charles Herbert Reilly</u> (1874-1948) and <u>William Crabtree</u> (1905-1991). In 1936 the New Zealand-born architect <u>Reginald Harold Uren</u> (1906-1988) joined the practice which was renamed Slater, Moberly & Uren. The practice later became Slater, Uren & Pike
