

## **How, William Murthwait 1873 - 1957**

William Murthwait How was born in Chesham, Buckinghamshire, England in July 1873 and was articled to Arthur Marshall, an engineer from 1892 to 1895, and to John Thomas Christopher (1829?-1910) and Eley Emlyn White (?-1900) of Christopher & White from 1896 to 1898. He remained briefly with them as an improver and worked as an assistant to Frederick George Knight (?-1930). He also attended the Royal Academy Schools in London.

How commenced practice as architect in London in 1899. From 1905 he was in partnership with [William James Kemp](#) and [William James Kemp, Jnr.](#) (1882-?) as [Kemp & How](#).

How was elected a Fellow of the Royal Institute of British Architects (FRIBA) in 1907. Hi's address was given as Chesham, Buckinghamshire in 1907; 6 Bloomsbury Square, London in 1907 and 1914; 4 Bloomsbury Square, London in 1926 and 1939. He died in Amersham Buckinghamshire on 4 October 1957
